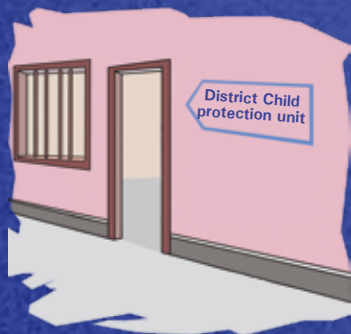

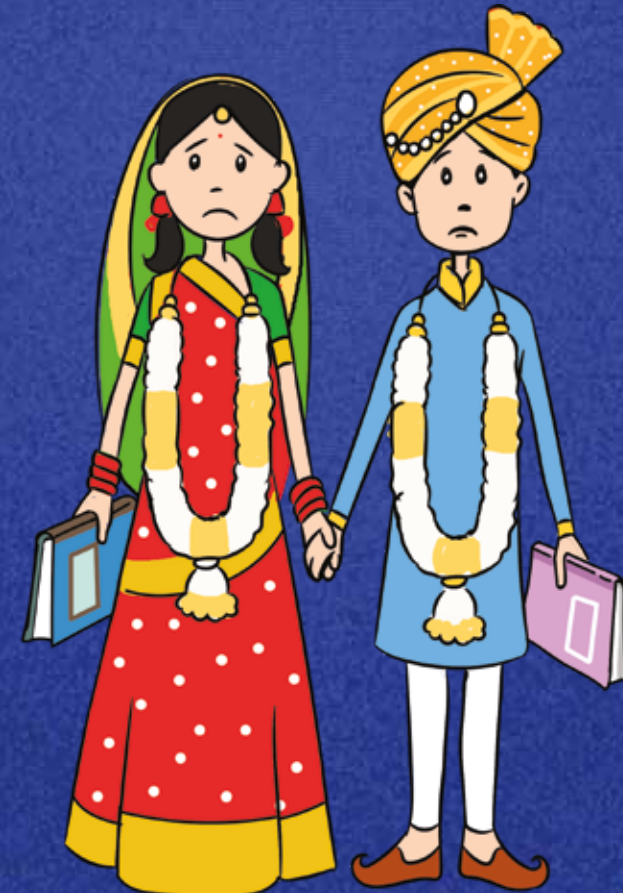

Roma's dreams could not come alive

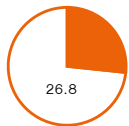

Roma's dreams were shattered

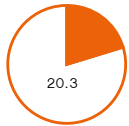
Child Marriage related Statistics

26.8 percent girls in our country get married below 18 years of age

Who is responsible for Roma's marriage?

Child marriage – A crime



Marrying a girl below 18 years and a boy below 21 years of age is a punishable offence. As per the Child Marriage Prevention Act 2006, any one pressuring a child to get married at an early age is liable for punishment. Additionally, all those will also be liable for punishment who:

- Encourage or help to get children married
- Do not take measures to stop a child marriage from taking place
- Participate in a child marriage

Punishment if found guilty:

Any one found guilty of associating with a child marriage can be put behind bars for up to 2 years.

The person is also liable to pay a fine of up to Rs 1 lakh in addition to imprisonment.
